

We are two eighty-year-olds who moved from Drogheda twelve months ago after being 55 years there to Sutton, where we expected to be close to our 3 families in Sutton, Clontarf and Greystones and to all the facilities in the area. We purchased our house in Binn Eadair view, because of the proximity to the Dart Station and the direct service to those locations. This move has led to a major reduction in car usage and our travel sustainability.

We are very disappointed to discover the changes to the service now proposed.

We are objecting to these changes on the following basis: -

Stopping the direct service. This will make getting to the City Centre and visiting our families much more difficult. We have medical and audiology appointments, which we attend frequently along with shopping and meeting family and friends. Changing trains at Howth Junction will be very inconvenient

through the year especially during cold weather in winter, when standing and waiting there will be most uncomfortable.

Opening level Crossing gates more frequently. This will impede traffic flow, leading to long traffic delays. This will make it more difficult to access the Dublin Road and to get through Sutton Cross. This is a route we take daily to shop, visit the GP and Pharmacy, our Church, and St. Fintan's Primary School where we sometimes do a school run.

Overall, we are extremely unhappy with the proposed changes.
