

Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to make the following online submission in respect of the above proposed Railway Order Application.

During the Public Consultation process I expressed strong opposition to to parts of this proposal, primarily being against the proposed ending of direct DART services from the Howth, Sutton and Bayside Stations.

I also expressed serious safety concerns in having to use Howth Junction + Donaghmede as a changeover station.

This station, unfortunately, has a long history of anti-social behaviour and while it is acknowledged that Irish Rail propose a re-design, it does not alay my fears. I would not feel safe having to use this station.

As a road user I am also very concerned about the knock-on effect this will undoubtedly have on traffic, in particular, at local level crossings and the amount of extra time the gates will have to be closed to let the required additional DARTS pass by, this will cause huge disruption.

I welcome the progress to extend the DART service to facilitate Drogheda but ask that the existing direct service (which I frequently use and have done, since it's inception) be retained and that other ways of managing the arriving DARTS from both sides at Howth Junction + Donaghmede be further explored without the need to changeover.
