

Objections to proposed Dart changes.

I'd like to object to the current application for changes to the direct dart service to Howth based on the following observations.

Waiting times, current waiting times at level crossings in the area can be up to 3 or 4 mins up to six times an hour, this already has an impact on tramc in the area. Iarnrod Eireann are

proposing a shuttle service between Howth Junction and Howth that will see shuttle trains running up to 12 times an hour with the possibility of 30mins of closure for every hour. This will have a negative impact on tramc that could be as far reaching as Portmarnock and Donaghmede. Emergency services may be compromised, bus routes will be delayed,

residents in houses close to level crossings will be blocked in or out of their homes. Pollution will increse.

Increased Journey Times. Having to change trains in Howth Junction will increase Journey times for all commuters.

Despite promises of upgrades to the layout and facilities in Howth Junction Station. It still remains a dimcult area to navigate especially for those more vulnerable in society. Security is currently non existent and lifts are regularly out of order. Having to change trains in Howth

Junction will discourage many people from commuting by train and instead taking their car.

We currently have two new building developments in Howth with more proposed in the near future. Our local population is growing. Will trains coming from Malahide have enough capacity during peak hours to comfortably carry all commuters from Howth, Sutton and

Bayside stations?

Howth is a well know and popular destination for both tourist and locals. Our current direct Dart service brings many people to howth on a daily basis throughout the year. Removing our direct service will have a negative impact on many local business especially within the

hospitality sector and this will also have a negative impact on employment opportunities in the area.
